She will also unpack turnaround, reflecting on the extraordinary 100-day sprint in 2025 when she and her team resurrected Australian Fashion Week after IMG announced its closure. Against all odds, AFW returned as a revitalised, sustainability-focused event that re-established Australia's place on the global fashion stage.
